Radio Free Palmer – Snow and Trail Report

The Alaska Avalanche Information Center brings you this weekly Snow Report thanks to support from Radio Free Palmer.

Sunny skies and warmer temperatures are in the forecast for the next week making it a great time to get outdoors.

Stay alert for variable conditions in the mountains. Always check current avalanche information before you go at Alaska Snow dot org.

Petersville area trail riding is reported to be good with a solid base. You'll find pockets of powder off trail. Watch for overflow on all lake inlets, outlets and creeks.

Hatcher Pass trails and snowmobile corridors will be groomed for the weekend with parking lots plowed and sanded making for good access to the backcountry.

North on the Glenn Highway toward Eureka, the snowpack is reported thin with rough conditions in many locations.
