Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center is excited to be back with your weekly Snow Report! We'll be bringing you the latest on snow and trail conditions, along with safety tips and upcoming training opportunities.

Winter snows may be slow in coming this season except at higher elevations. The Turnagain Pass area avalanche danger is rated as CONSIDERABLE on ALL slope aspects at elevations near and above treeline. Avalanches have been reported in the area, and conditions are NOT expected to improve this week with more new snow and wind obscuring recent slides.

The weather forecast for this week is for cool temps with occasional snow showers and light winds.

Most of the all-season trails in the Mat-Su and Hatcher Pass still lack sufficient snow. Snowmobilers will have to be patient until trails have established a good base.
