For all you powder hounds, Turnagain Pass and portions of the Kenai Mountains have snow! However, the avalanche danger is **CONSIDERABLE** and extreme caution and conservative planning is highly recommended. Be sure to take your beacon, probe, shovel, and, most important, your brain!

Cross-country ski trails on Anchorage Upper Hillside are reported to be in good shape with moderate snow coverage. Kincaid park snow guns are now dowsing the trails with man-made snow thanks to our cooler temps.

Mat-Su and Glenn Hwy area trails still need more snow for motorized travel but hikers and fat-bikers should find the trails perfect.
