Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from AARP Alaska!

The National Weather Service is forecasting cold temps throughout Southcentral for the next several days with a chance of snow later this week on the Kenai Peninsula and perhaps out the eastern end of the Glenn Hwy.

Turnagain Pass area avalanche danger is rated as MODERATE on all slope aspects at elevations near and above treeline. Recent avalanches have been reported in the Seattle Ridge area. Cold temps and wind call for careful planning if you venture out.

No trail reports from the Eureka area yet this year but stay tuned! Mat-Su allseason trails still need more snow for motorized use. Hatcher Pass trails Archangel and Independence Mine have been groomed and users report good condition.
