## 95.5 The Pass Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from AARP Alaska!

Temperatures are cold, so pack some extra layers if you plan to hit the trails this week. Weather forecasters are calling for cooler temps, some snow and light winds.

Hatcher Pass trails remain closed to motorized riders due to low snow levels, but Archangel and Independence Mine cross country trails are groomed and in good condition. Hiking and biking should be good, but be aware of changing conditions as we go through the week.

Down Turnagain Pass way forecasters report the avalanche danger as MODERATE with recent avalanches reported in the Seattle Ridge area. As always, be cautious and conservative in route planning and decision-making!

Mat-Su lakes are freezing with colder temperatures, however snowmobiling is not advised at this time.
