## 95.5 The Pass Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from 95.5 the Pass!

Last weekend's storms brought significant snowfall accumulation to Southcentral Alaska! Cold temperatures are in store the rest of this week with warming trend and more snow in the forecast over the weekend south of Anchorage and early next week for the Mat-Su area.

Avalanche danger is high in all backcountry areas. Hatcher Pass is reporting CONSIDERABLE avalanche danger above 3,500 foot elevation, and MODERATE below that. Turnagain Pass and Summit Lake areas report MODERATE avalanche danger and more likely on steeper terrain. Careful snowpack evaluation and extreme caution in route-planning is highly advised in all Southcentral mountain areas.

Most Mat-Su area Nordic trails have been groomed and reported to provide great classic and skate cross-country skiing. Fat Bike enthusiasts report multi-use trails can be challenging with the deep snow but still great fun.
