## 95.5 The Pass Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from 95.5 the Pass!

Our latest dump of snow in Southcentral has made for VERY dangerous avalanche conditions in all mountain backcountry areas including Hatcher Pass, the Chugach Front Range and Southern Kenai Mountains. This week, expect dramatically warmer temperatures. High winds move into Portage Valley and Turnagain Arm, and heavy snows are forecast for the Eastern Kenai Peninsula to include Turnagain Pass.

CONSIDERABLE avalanche danger exists above 3,500 foot level at Hatcher Pass, Turnagain Pass and Summit Lake areas report CONSIDERABLE avalanche danger above 2,500 foot level and MODERATE below that. Before venturing out, get the latest avalanche information. Careful snowpack evaluation and extreme caution in route-planning is highly advised in all Southcentral mountain areas.

Snowmachiners! Latest trail openings are Eklutna Lake, Eagle River Greenbelt and North Fork trails, as well as Bird Valley.
