Hey Snow Lovers, the Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from Moving 105.7!

Expect a mix of clouds, rain and snow to continue through this weekend bringing more fresh snow to slopes and trails around Anchorage and the Mat Su Valley. Remember that this new precipitation may increase the likelihood of natural and human triggered avalanches in mountain areas throughout Southcentral Alaska.

According to avalanche forecasters, a 'tricky' problem exists for predicting when and where avalanches may occur, especially with this warming trend. Careful snowpack evaluation, cautious route-finding, conservative decision-making, and effective terrain management are essential for safe recreation in the mountains this weekend.

For you skiers, Alyeska Ski Resort is reporting powder conditions and will be holding their North Face challenge this weekend. Hilltop Ski Area in Anchorage and Arctic Valley are also open on the weekends and expecting good conditions.

All trails in the Denali State Park are open to snowmachines except ski trails and Curry Ridge Trail. Ski trails are reported to be in good shape. However, overflow warnings remain in place for most lakes and rivers in the Southcentral area.

Remember if you are heading into the mountains go prepared. Take your beacon, shovel and probe and know how to use them so you can **Live to Ride Another Day!** Get more information and details for upcoming training opportunities at [AlaskaSnow.org](http://AlaskaSnow.org).
