Eh Ha! Calling all snow riders! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center brings you this report thanks to support from Country Legends.

Don't put away your hats and gloves just yet, forecasters are calling for clear, cold and windy conditions this week with little to no precipitation expected.

Snow forecasters report avalanche danger moderate to considerable. Stay alert for wind slabs and loose powder. Be sure to check current avalanche information at Alaska Snow dot org before you venture into the backcountry.

Last week's snow blanketed area trails and slopes with three to 12 inches of fresh powder making this a great time to get out and enjoy Alaska. You'll want to bundle up in layers for comfort.

Snowmachine riders are advised that overflow warnings remain in place for many Southcentral area lakes and rivers, including Nancy Lakes trail system, Byers Lake inlet and outlet waters, and the Eagle River Greenbelt and North Fork Access areas.
