Sunshine, calm winds and warmer temperatures are expected this weekend which should make it more comfortable to get outdoors and enjoy Alaska.

Stay alert for variable conditions in the mountains. Always check current avalanche information before you go at Alaska Snow dot org.

Around Anchorage from Hillside to the Coastal Trail, skiing and fat biking conditions are firm and opportunities abound.

Multi-use and ski-only trails around the Mat-Su Valley are also reported in good shape, most with recent grooming.

North towards Petersville trail riders will find groomed conditions with pockets of powder off trail. Watch for overflow on all lake inlets, outlets and creeks.

On the Glenn Highway, the snowpack is still thin with riders reporting rough conditions in many locations.
