## KMBQ Snow Report

Hey Snow Lovers! The Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your weekly Snow Report thanks to support from Q99.7!

Sunshine, calm winds and warmer temperatures are expected this weekend which should make it more comfortable to get outdoors and enjoy Alaska.

Stay alert for variable conditions in the mountains. Always check current avalanche information before you go at Alaska Snow dot org.

Around Anchorage from Hillside to the Coastal Trail, skiing and fat biking conditions are firm and opportunities abound.

In the Mat-Su, Petersville area trail riding is reported to be good with a solid base. You'll find pockets of powder off trail. Watch for overflow on all lake inlets, outlets and creeks.

Hatcher Pass trails and snowmobile corridors will be groomed for the weekend with parking lots plowed and sanded making for good access to the backcountry.

North on the Glenn Highway toward Eureka, the snowpack is reported thin with rough conditions in many locations.

The Alaska Avalanche Information Center will be hosting an Advanced Sledders Level 1 Training at Thompson Pass March 17 to 19.
