Happy Holidays from the Alaska Avalanche Information Center here with your Christmas Snow Report thanks to support from our friends at Alaska Snowmobile Salvage and 95.5 The Pass.

The stream of unstable, roller coaster weather is likely to continue this week. Following a few days of clearing, another round of snow is expected across the Kenai, Anchorage and Mat-Su through Christmas. Temperatures are predicted to hover near freezing, dropping off to the mid 20's at night.

Chugach State Park has a host of fat biking opportunities but be aware of icy conditions. Snow riders will need to head north on the Glenn Highway to Eureka or on the Parks to Petersville.

Due to widespread, unstable snow conditions, it is critical to evaluate terrain carefully when traveling in the mountains. Use cautious route finding and conservative decision making practices. Carry safety equipment, know how to use it and travel one at a time, regrouping in safe zones.

The AAIC will be hosting a full day avalanche rescue workshop on Saturday, December 27th at Arctic Valley. Check Alaska Snow dot org for the latest snow conditions and training opportunities.
