


MISSION

Forecasts

Our professional team of regional forecasters produce detailed and timely avalanche danger bulletins based on conditions and deliver critical winter public safety information.

Observations

An online public user database allows individuals to report their own findings for recent weather, snowpack and avalanche activity and view the reports entered by other users.

Education/Outreach

A variety of programs and resources deliver information and training to a range of experience levels and user groups throughout our regional avalanche centers and beyond.

Weather Stations


We work to maintain and install remote weather stations to data-sparse regions of Alaska and provide an online web tool for regional communities to access and visualize data.

Consultation

State and local needs for current snowpack, weather and avalanche information is increasing along with our ability to provide available resources and trainings.

Facilitate Statewide Networking

Partnerships across the state including commercial, governmental and other non-profits demonstrates the value of working together to increase safety during the winter.





CHALLENGES TO OVERCOME

- Continued need to help provide education and access to information more easily throughout the state
- Our services are non-revenue producing (forecasts, observations, weather station data, outreach)
- Increase public awareness of funding sources- we are not funded by state/federal governments
- Unrestricted income is revenue needed to support continued operational expenses

The AAIC serves as a statewide information and resource hub by providing direct links and resources to other independent centers in Alaska and beyond.


STRENGTHEN


